<p>Create a board game to help your friends to learn their times tables. You could use the internet for inspiration (good practice for using a search engine!).</p>	<p>Make an information poster about Mary Anning, the famous fossil collector. Include images and interesting facts.</p> 	<p>Find the latitude and longitude coordinates for 10 places around the world. Record the places and coordinates in a table. You could include a map or photos if you wanted.</p>
<p>Go out for a nature walk and take some artistic pictures or sketches of the signs of winter.</p> 	<p>Write a poem on the theme of volcanoes. You might like to write about an eruption, a specific volcano that you have learned about or the damage caused after a volcanic eruption. Try to include expanded noun phrases in your poem (remember DAN). For example, the scorching ash, some exploding lava or lots of jet-black clouds.</p>	<p>Create a piece of artwork inspired by William Morris. This could be a mood board, a painting, a sketch or a colouring. What was he inspired by?</p>
