

Physical Development

There are numerous whole school PE events taking place this term including sports day and sports week. These extra activities will provide the children with opportunities to develop a wide range of sporting skills and techniques including developing their balance, coordination and team spirit! In PE this term, we continue to work with **Premier Sport**. The children will play games with partners and small groups, following rules and working on key skills to support their core development. During Forest School sessions, children will further develop their use of a range of tools and will visit the village allotments periodically to check on their growing fruit and vegetables!

Communication and Language

This term, during our discussions, the children will use well-structured sentences and a wide range of vocabulary to share and explain their ideas. They will talk about their own experiences of travelling, including their own family holidays and discussions of different modes of transport.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

In SCARF lessons, and through the 'Move it' project, the children will talk about how to be their very best through having a healthy mind and body. The children will develop their understanding of themselves as unique individuals. As we head to the end of the school year, we hope the children will follow our class rules and routines with independence and confidence.

Mathematics

This term for Reception will be an opportunity to consolidate learning and revise areas of the maths curriculum which have been particularly challenging. We will also introduce the rekenrek which the children will use frequently once in Year 1. The Nursery children will continue to develop their understanding of numbers to 5, consolidating their counting skills and recognition of numerals. They will also begin to create their own patterns and use some mathematical terms such as more and less.

RE - The children will be exploring the natural world around them as they investigate our unit question, "What is special about our world?" Through outdoor experiences and discussions, they will be encouraged to notice and appreciate nature and think about the world they live in. We will introduce the Christian Creation story from *Genesis* and learn that many Christians believe God created the world.

Expressive Arts and Design - We will learn and perform a variety of songs throughout the term. Children will complete a range of art projects inspired by different flowers and will use mirrors to explore reflections when drawing. In Forest School, children will create outdoor artwork, including transient art. They will also continue to explore their own ideas using a wide range of materials during provision time.

Understanding the World - We will be exploring the wider world and the global community that we are part of. The children will learn about different countries, cultures and ways of life, and how people and places can be different around the world. Using maps, globes and other resources, they will explore oceans, deserts, rainforests and many of the world's natural wonders. We will finish our term learning about water. The children will explore floating and sinking, freezing and melting through a range of practical investigations and activities.

Literacy

For Nursery's final term, they will revise the sounds and consolidate their listening skills in preparation for starting Reception in September. For children in Reception, this term the focus will continue to be on developing children's fluency when reading - we will encourage children to recognise some common words on sight instead of 'sounding out' each word. You can support your child with this by practising the 'speed words' in the front of their reading books. Now that the children are becoming more confident with their writing, we are encouraging them to explore more ambitious sentence structures and vocabulary alongside encouraging independence the term.
