Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had a super week of learning and extra activities taking place. On Monday the team from Kier, on behalf of West Northants, came and spoke to the children about building roads and the gritting of them. Miss Curtis had set up a Where's Wally Themed Orienteering activity which all classes got to explore. After break children split into their houses and wrote an amazing story called The Journey. Mrs Connor had written an opening and each team took a different part of the story before we put it all together and joined on Teams to read the whole thing through – it is a great story – with an unusual reference to chicken nuggets on a few occasions!
