On Monday Miss Davis launched **STEM week** with an assembly thinking about change and adaptation which is this year's theme. Each class has carried out some different investigations over the week – I had great fun with Maple yesterday challenging them to get their whole body through an A5 piece of paper – can you do this? Years 1- 6 had a virtual visit to the farm as well – KS1 thought about being change champions, thinking how they can be more environmentally friendly in a number of avenues including biodiversity, energy and waste. Meanwhile KS2 looked at amazing adaptations and thought more about climate change – they explored cows teeth, poo, and a plant psychologist shared interesting facts about climate change resistant crops. All virtual farm visits got an insight into cookery too with chef Tom – I attach a recipe you might like to try!

Oak class got to visit a farm for real this week. A tractor came to school and collected them on the trailer before they explored Forceleap Farm – they learnt about the crops and machinery used and saw the calves and lambs that had been recently born – it was a fantastic trip.

Similarly, this week **Sycamore class** were superb on the trip to Stanwick Lakes – here they got to share their extensive rivers knowledge and wowed the leaders at the centre with their understanding. They also got to learn lots more on the day tool
