Dear Parents and Carers

Despite a shorter week it has still been a busy week of learning.

Oak class have been exploring about different animals and, in Drawing Club, read Monkey Puzzle by Julia Donaldson. **Chestnut class** have been thinking about our school in the past as well as learning more about what a parable is, focusing on the Prodigal Son. **Sycamore class** have had their next Ukulele lesson as well as understanding more about farming in Ancient Sumer whilst **Maple class** have compared the Minoans and Mycenaean and continued discussions in PSHE about Growing and Changing.

Next week **Year 6 will sit their SATs tests**. These are set by the government and children across the country sit them. They are fixed in their timings and are formal in their delivery. We will have governors in school monitoring the process and may get visited by the Local Authority to also check our procedures. The Year 6's are very well prepared for these tests and have worked so very hard to ensure they are in the best place. I know they will all give their absolute best to what they face but it is important to remember that they are just a snapshot in time and do not celebrate all the other brilliant qualities they have.

As you will have read, I am having to take some time to recover and am therefore reducing my hours spent in school. I will be however be in school to support Year 6 pupils and staff through the tests next week each morning.
